Being enrolled in the Ohio Dominican University Dual Enrollment program gives you access to on-campus and on-line resources such as:

- The Academic Resource Center at ODU. The Academic Resource Center is dedicated to
 helping students succeed and excel in their studies. The ARC addresses the needs of all Ohio
 Dominican students. To facilitate student success, the ARC provides a variety of study skills
 workshops and help sheets, as well as tutoring in math, writing, and subject area courses.
- Career Development. Students can utilize on-line resources on our Career Development website. Project Jumpstart students may specifically wish to take advantage of the Occupational Information Resources.
- Library Resources and Services. The ODU Library is a valuable resource offering an online catalog with a collection of over 106,000 books, videos, and DVDs, access to over 165 online and full-text research databases, thousands of electronic books & journals, and nearly 600 continuing subscriptions to print journals and magazines. The library staff strives to help patrons search effectively so that they can find the most relevant information, evaluate what they have found, and use that information effectively-in socially responsible and ethical ways.
- Free Official Panther Student Identification Card. Project JumpStart students can stop by the
 business office located in Erskine Hall Room 133 to have their picture taken for their official ODU
 student ID. Student ID's provide full student privileges for the library, sporting events, and other
 regular student activities.

Registration

Student Status

When you participate in the Project JumpStart program you are officially registered as a non-matriculated student at Ohio Dominican University. When you attend college after high school graduation, you will be a first time freshman with earned college credit. Earning dual enrollment credits does not make you a transfer student.

Dropping a course

Should you decide that you no longer wish to receive dual enrollment credit for a course you must complete a drop form by the posted deadline. It is your responsibility to complete the necessary paperwork by the posted deadline and to submit this information to the Registrar's Office. The drop form is located online under the Project JumpStart section of the website.

Important Deadlines

Please see the calendar of events on the Project JumpStart section of the ODU website for all posted deadlines.

Tuition

The tuition for Diocesan students is \$65 per credit hour. For all other students the tuition rate is \$75 per credit hour. Students should check the calendar of events for registration and payment deadlines. The application fee is waived for all dual enrollment students.

Refund Policy

Students who drop their dual enrollment course prior to the posted deadline will receive a complete refund. Courses dropped after the deadline will not receive any refund.

Grades

The grade that is issued by your high school teacher is the same grade that is recorded on your official Ohio Dominican University transcript at the end of the term.

Transferring Credit / Transcript Request Procedures

If you choose to attend Ohio Dominican University after graduation, you do not need to take any additional steps to have your dual enrollment credit transferred to your degree program. The application of dual enrollment credit towards your degree requirements will be automatic.

If you choose to attend elsewhere after graduation you will need to request that an official ODU transcript be sent to the college or university that you plan to attend. ODU does not send transcripts without your written request. Your official ODU transcripts may be obtained from the Registrar's Office. The request must be in writing. The Transcript Request form is available in the Registrar's Office or on the ODU website http://www.ohiodominican.edu/Transcripts

The acceptance of transfer credit is at the discretion of the receiving institution. College policies vary in regard to transfer credit. It is sometimes helpful to have the course description and the course syllabi available when you meet with the college official who will make the decision about transfer of credit.

If you are denied credit, talk with your academic advisor first. Then ask the Registrar what the school's policy is about college credits earned at other institutions. Be aware that some colleges make decisions about credit at the departmental or even the faculty member level. Talking to the right people will make a difference. Nearly all colleges have some kind of appeals process. Even though you will be a new member of the academic community, you have the right to exercise this option.
